

"Following the public consultation last year, we have and are continuing to review the feedback and develop the scheme.



We plan to host a public drop-in exhibition, as well as engage directly with yourselves and other key groups, so we will be in touch with you once we are in a position to do so."



- Harlow Nurseries (site ref: H65) allocated for residential with a potential yield of 40 dwellings
- Draft plans shared show 57-62 dwellings

Plans approved by council to dispose of land. Will be down to NYC

- Redirect vehicle access to retain amenity of public right of way
